January 17, 1923 - July 28, 2014

Eugenia P. Anagnostopulos, 91, of Johnstown, passed away Monday, July 28, 2014 at the Wilkinson Center, Amsterdam, NY. Eugenia was born on January 17, 1923 to the late Peter and Alexandra Anagnostopulos, Greek immigrants who settled in Johnstown. Her parents established the Johnstown Candy Kitchen, which later became Pete's Snack Bar. She and her siblings worked in the family business while growing up. She graduated from Johnstown High School and remained at Pete's, working with her parents before taking over and operating the restaurant herself. Jean passed the business on to her nephew Michael who continues to operate Pete's. Jean worked with Michael until the age of 91. Jean will be remembered for being devoted to her family and the family business and her strong work ethic. Taking care of her customers, greeting old friends, and family was her greatest joy in life. Jean loved to give everyone the chance to be the "kid in the candy store". She leaves many beautiful memories to all who knew her and she will be missed dearly.

Jean is survived by her brother John of Gloversville, her nephews Michael (Tammy) of Johnstown, Mark (Janet Zinter) of Brattleboro, VT, Louis (Karen), Matthew of Rapid City, SD and Peter of Gloversville; also her grandnieces and grandnephews Clair, Jack and Joseph Anagnostopulos, Summer Logue and her son Caiden, John Anagnostopulos and Angelia Van Pelt. She is predeceased by her siblings Mary, Angelo and William; her two sister-in-laws both named Gloria.

We cherish the memories of our excursions by foot, on roller skates and by bicycle to "Pete's," where we spent 5 cents on penny candy that Jeannie carefully placed in a brown paper bag or a Hershey bar or Necco Wafers! Jeannie welcomed all of us and waited patiently while we gazed into the glass front display case, with shelves stacked high with chocolate bars, taffy and licorice bites. On hot summer nights, Jeannie made the best home-made ice cream cones in town -- to the delight of our young tribe.
