Frances R. Cuomo, 99, of Gloversville, passed away on February 3, 2019, at Nathan Littauer Hospital Nursing Home. Born in Gloversville, August 30, 1919, she was the daughter of the late Luigi and Carmela Auricchio Cuomo.

Frances was a graduate of Gloversville High School, Gloversville Business School, Russell Sage College and a student at Ithaca College for post graduate studies. She worked as a bookkeeper and secretary before moving onto becoming an elementary school teacher, teaching fourth and fifth grades at the Berkshire School in the town of Johnstown and sixth grade in the Greater Johnstown School District. 


