Margaret Spanenberg Teetz, a woman of unwavering faith and a lifetime of service, went home to be with her Lord on Sunday, March 1, 2026. Born in Cleveland, Ohio, on March 16, 1942, Margaret carried a spirit of compassion that would define her 83 years of life.

A proud graduate of Albion College, Margaret dedicated her career to the well-being of others. For 33 years, she was a steady hand and a compassionate voice at the Fulton County Department of Social Services. Even in retirement, her heart for service never wavered; she spent another decade as a Chaplain at Nathan Littauer Hospital, offering comfort and prayer to those in their most vulnerable moments.

Margaret's faith was the North Star of her life. After years as a devoted member of St. John's Episcopal Church in Johnstown, she followed a deeper calling to the diaconate. Following her training and ordination, she served faithfully as a Deacon at Christ Church in Schenectady for 10 years—a role that allowed her to live out her commitment to "being the hands and feet" of her faith.

Above all, Margaret's greatest joy was her family. She was the heart of her home and leaves behind a legacy of love in her sons, Jason (Amanda) and Kevin (Liza), and her stepson, Michael. Her spirit lives on in her beloved grandchildren—Logan, Gavin, Andrew, and Cassidy—who were the lights of her life, as well as her many nieces, nephews, and step-grandchildren.

She now joins those who went before her, including her parents, William and Florence; her brother, Richard; her sister, Jean; stepdaughter, Audrey; and her former husband, Howard Jr.
