



Roy Earl Warner DeCristofaro

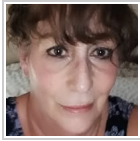
December 22, 1971 - October 26, 2018

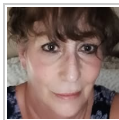

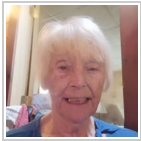
